Minister launches civic healthcare project

Chengalpattu, Feb 13: Tamil Nadu's Minister for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises T.M. Anbarasan, laid the foundation stone for the construction of a new Zonal Office building and a Government Hospital building at Kambur Street in Ward No. 48, Zone-5, Tambaram City Municipal Corporation. The project will be executed at an estimated cost of Rs.6.55 crore under the 2025-2026 General Fund allocation, marking a significant step toward strengthening civic administration and public healthcare infrastructure in the rapidly growing urban region.

The proposed infrastructure development aims to enhance administrative efficiency and improve access to essential medical services for residents of Tambaram and surrounding areas. The new zonal office building is expected to streamline civic services, while the hospital facility will contribute to strengthening grassroots healthcare delivery and ensuring timely medical assistance to the public.

Addressing the gathering, Minister T.M. Anbarasan emphasised the State Government's commitment to improving urban infrastructure and citizen services. He noted that investments in administrative and healthcare facilities reflect the government's focus on inclusive growth and sustainable urban development. The Minister highlighted that such projects are designed to meet the needs of expanding populations while ensuring transparency, efficiency, and accessibility in governance.

The event was attended by Chengalpattu District Collector T. Sneha, who underscored the importance of coordinated efforts between the district administration and local bodies in executing development projects effectively. Tambaram MLA Thiru S.R. Raju and Pallavaram MLA Thiru I. Kannanidhi also participated in the ceremony, expressing their support for infrastructure initiatives that directly benefit the public and strengthen service delivery mechanisms.

Special PDS camp in Ranipet

To ensure the effective implementation of the Public Distribution Scheme (PDS), a special grievance redressal camp is being conducted every month. Accordingly, the special camp will be held on February 14, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the respective Taluk Office.

During the camp, services related to electronic family cards will be provided, including change of address, correction of names, addition or deletion of family members, change of mobile number, application for new family cards,

and requests for duplicate cards. Errors in the photograph of the head of the family in electronic family cards will also be corrected, and photographs will be uploaded on the spot, if required.

In addition, members of the public can submit grievances related to the Public Distribution Scheme and obtain necessary assistance. Complaints regarding deficiencies in goods and services sold in the private market can also be addressed. Guidance will be provided under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, and petitions seeking appropriate action may be submitted at the camp.

Arrangements will also be made to issue authorization certificates for senior citizens and beneficiaries who are unable to visit fair price shops due to illness or other reasons. If there are any complaints regarding the functioning of fair price shops or the quality of goods sold in the private market, prompt action will be taken upon receipt of grievances.

District Collector IU. Chandrakala has appealed to the public to make use of the special camp and submit their petitions to resolve issues related to the Public Distribution Scheme.
